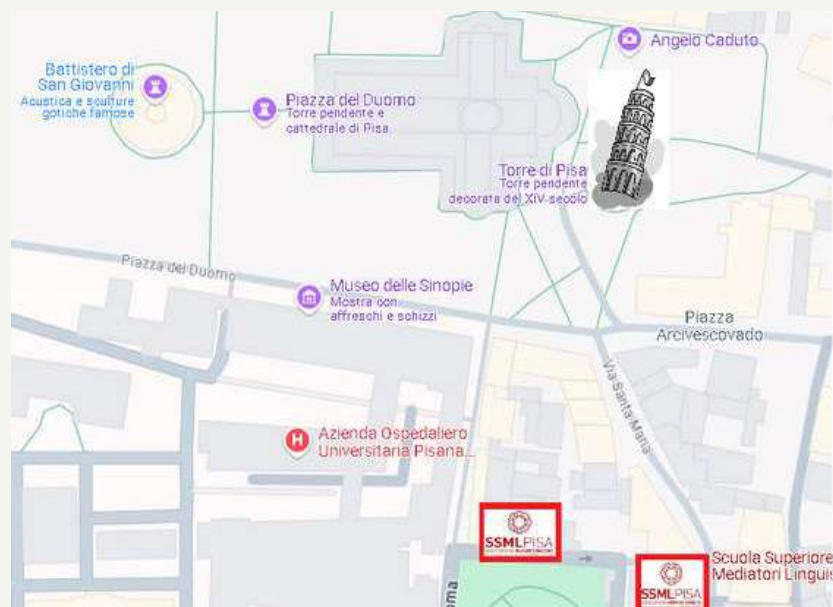

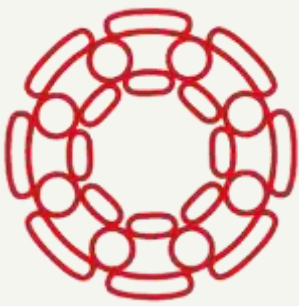

EU citizens

Health care assistance is available to all European citizens (belonging to EU Member States and EEA States) who have the EHIC/TEAM card (European Health Insurance Card) or who enrol in the Italian National Health Service.

If you have the EHIC/TEAM card, you can go directly to any family doctor, during the outpatient time, and have the right to any services needed, on a case-by-case basis. For a list of doctors and outpatient schedules, please visit the page [Ricerca medici](#) ("Search for doctors"). Students must bring their health card and a photocopy of the card to the clinic. By doing so, the doctor will not request a payment for the visit.

Those who want to join the Italian National Health Service must ask their country's health insurance scheme to issue the certificate E106, E109, or S1 and present it at the counter of the Health District on Via Garibaldi 198.

If you have the requested forms and the tax code issued by the *Agenzia delle Entrate* (see below), the registration is free and you have the right to choose your doctor and take advantage of basic services.

If you plan on staying in Italy for more than three months, you can register with the local Italian health care system. In this case, you must ask your National Health Institute for the European S1 Form and hand it in at Via Cocchi, 7, 56121 Pisa. You will be registered free of charge and will be able to choose and have your doctor in Pisa.

Non-EU/EEA Students

Medical hospital insurance is necessary in order to obtain a Visa and/or Residence Permit. In case you arrive in Italy without insurance coverage, you can make a voluntary inscription to the Local Health Offices (Azienda Sanitaria Locale). If you have no insurance coverage upon your arrival to Pisa, you can request assistance at the Local Health Offices (Via Cocchi, 7, 56121 Pisa)



EMERGENCIES

Guardia Medica

On public holidays and at night, basic medical assistance is guaranteed by the **Guardia Medica**.

The Guardia Medica service guarantees basic medical assistance at home in emergencies that occur at night or on public holidays.

More specifically, 8 pm-8 am from Monday to Friday, between 10 am Saturday and 8 am Monday, or on any day following a public holiday.

A STUDENT-FRIENDLY CITY

Pisa is a vibrant city with a historic centre full of meeting spots for young people. The **Lungarni** are the ultimate evening gathering place, along with **Piazza Chiara Gambacorti** (known to locals as *Piazza della Pera*), **Piazza delle Vettovaglie**, **Piazza Dante**, and **Piazza della Berlina**, all perfect for an aperitif. For a more relaxed atmosphere, there's **Piazza Santa Caterina** (officially *Piazza Martiri della Libertà*). The **Tramontana** side of the historic center, where we are also located, is particularly lively, thanks to its many pubs and venues.
